

# Workers' Compensation Pharmacy Benefit Network

### **Workers' Compensation Pharmacy Benefit Network**

AIG, your workers' compensation claim administrator, has selected Tmesys as its workers' compensation pharmacy benefit network (PBN), to provide medication for your work-related injury.

This PBN provides that medication prescribed for treating your work injury may be obtained from pharmacies specified in your PBN. If you have any questions about how to obtain prescribed medication, call the following toll free number 866.599.5426.

#### **How to Obtain Medication**

Please read the following information carefully as it contains instructions on the required use of a participating PBN pharmacy to receive your medication.

### **PBN Description**

- You should present your First Fill or workers' compensation pharmacy card to a participating PBN pharmacy in order to receive medication.
- Only medication used to treat your work-related injury is covered.
- Some medication may not be on the authorized list, in which case the pharmacy will contact Tmesys to obtain approval while you are at the pharmacy.
- Your prescribed medication may be subject to Utilization Review at the request of your claim administrator.

### **New Injury**

- 1 Upon receiving notice of injury, your employer will provide you with a First Fill Card to be used at a participating PBN pharmacy.
- 2. Give the card to the pharmacist with your prescription.
- 3. The pharmacist will fill your prescription. By using a participating PBN pharmacy, you should not receive a bill for your medication.
- 4. Once your injury has been reported to AIG, a workers' compensation pharmacy card will be mailed to you.
- 5. Use the pharmacy card each time you have a prescription filled for your work-related injury.

### **Existing Injury**

Medication for your work-related injury will continue to be provided (subject to PBN description) under the new PBN effective immediately.

- 1. You will receive a workers' compensation pharmacy card in the mail.
- 2. If you are receiving your work-injury related medication from a non-PBN provider, your prescription must be transferred to a PBN pharmacy before your next fill. Simply go to a PBN pharmacy with your pharmacy card and request that the pharmacist transfer your prescription to that pharmacy.
- 3. If you are already using a PBN pharmacy, take this card in the next time you need a re-fill or have a new prescription related to your work injury.
- 4. The card will identify you to the pharmacist as participating in the PBN program.
- 5. The pharmacist will fill your prescription. By using a participating PBN pharmacy, you should not receive a bill for your medication.
